



Administrative Fellowship Program

Maimonides Medical Center is the largest hospital in Brooklyn, NY and the borough's leading independent health care system. In service of our mission to educate healthcare professionals, we offer a year-long administrative fellowship program with a start date in early summer after the conclusion of the academic year. The program is based in Brooklyn, NY, and we are making two positions available for the 2025-2026 cohort.

Maimonides began offering our **general assignment administrative fellowship** in June of 2021. The program is structured to place our fellows through a series of rotations that allow for deep integration into our business units. At the same time, the fellows gain exposure to our senior leadership and are given the opportunity to work closely with them on a number of initiatives. Through this matrix, the program develops the fellows in the means by which work is done at Maimonides and prepares them for future leadership roles in the industry.

All fellows are temporary, full-time, and salaried, with the possibility of graduation into a permanent role upon successful completion of the program. Those interested in applying to the program should do so via the National Administrative Fellowship Centralized Application Service (NAFCAS) portal no later than September 27, 2024.
